Based on a foundation of research inspired by the 826 Valencia Model, this creative destination is located in Rotherham town centre but works across Yorkshire, Humberside and beyond, and originally opened its doors in February 2016.

The Emporium of Stories allows us to create a strong foundation for the charity - raising funds through trading (café/bookshop, children's parties, weddings, events, etc), and expanding the provision and engagement within Yorkshire and beyond.





Grimm & Co are looking for Trustees who will help support the charity with its governance, fundraising, growth and impact. The Grimm & Co Board has nine trustees who work on a three-year cycle, with the option of reapplying to serve a maximum of nine years. Our current Board offer a wealth of experience and skills and are excited to welcome new expertise and input to drive the charity forward in these next exciting development stages.

Expectations

The Board of Trustees meets here at The Emporium of Stories four times a year, once a quarter. We prefer face-to-face meetings but are happy to arrange virtual meetings on occasion and to assist with any accessibility needs.

To ensure an effective and efficient running of the charity, the Board has various subcommittees which include Governance and Finance. We would expect as a trustee that you would be involved in at least one subcommittee.

This is a volunteer role and apart from your time, which we are extremely grateful for, the role should come at no additional cost to you. All reasonable out-of-pocket expenses will be paid.

The term of the appointment is three years with the opportunity to renew the term to a maximum of nine years.

How did it all begin...

Grimm & Co. was founded by Dr Deborah Bullivant MBE in 2013. Deborah is an educationalist and social entrepreneur who built Grimm & Co on a bedrock of robust research, that set out the design and philosophy blueprint for a successful Yorkshire writing centre based in Rotherham, for children and young people and to support those who influence their development.

Deborah's own career path didn't start well, as personal circumstances meant leaving school early with no qualifications and challenges that affected her opportunities. However, although it wasn't a traditional route, this lived experience has equipped her with insider experience that she draws on for her work. Deborah has experience of homelessness, finding herself a single parent at age 19 with limited support around her. Low self-esteem sometimes led to shaky choices that impacted on her life for many years. The responsibility for another human at age 19 provided motivation to change their circumstances, leading to working 3 jobs (cleaning, packing in a factory, behind a bar) that would support her to go to college. It was here that a tutor recognised something in Deborah and suggested she pursue a career in teaching, a childhood ambition long abandoned. This belief from another person gave her the confidence to try.

A key skill throughout all these experiences that served Deborah well was her socio-cultural literacies, developed through her childhood with story-telling and imagination at the heart of this. Her ability to make meaning of the world around her and communicate with others was critical for survival and opportunities. Knowing, first hand, the importance of this as a core skill, regardless of your circumstances, led to her absolute commitment to ensure others have these skills and opportunities.

Deborah's educational career path started in community education, then as headteacher, before going on to national educational leadership and advisory roles. Specialising in literacy, Deborah championed arts-based learning approaches to narrow the gap for marginalised children, young people and adults.

Deborah achieved a Doctor of Education (University of Sheffield) in 2022, with a thesis examining the origins of an arts-based signature pedagogy, with Grimm & Co at the heart of the research. In June 2022, Deborah was awarded an MBE in the Queen's Jubilee Honours List, for her dedication to children and young people's literacy in Rotherham.
